

Below, we spotlight West High Performing Arts Center of Torrance, California, and their production of Shrek The Musical. Theater and Artistic Director Christy Orabuena shared with Playbill what her students loved about Shrek.

What is your proudest moment as an educator? **Christy Orabuena:** My proudest moments as an educator are any time I see my students growing and succeeding as adults. I love when I see pictures of them hanging out 10 years later. It shows me that the friendships that were created in my program are meant to last a lifetime. I am the proudest of the relationships that have formed over the last 21 years. Just this past month, I had a former student text me a picture of him in his theatre sweatshirt in celebration of our opening night. Even though he is now 28 and lives across the country, he took the time to send his best wishes to the kids in the cast. These text messages keep me going as an educator, as we are never sure if we are reaching the students.

What made you pick Shrek?

I choose shows based on the talent that I have that year. I have a lot of talented kids this year and Shrek provided the amounts of roles I needed. I also needed a well-known show for our audience. After COVID, I wanted to do five years of big musicals with name-recognition to get the audience back in the seats.



What did the kids love about the show?

The kids loved the music and they loved dancing in Duloc. They were most proud of how all the design elements in the show turned out. It was the biggest, most expensive show we had ever done.

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
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
